Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Dear Friends.

One of the key tasks facing any Christian community is to put into action the gospel of forgiveness, by refusing to harbour thoughts of hatred and revenge for our enemies. Anger, bitterness and resentment are the moral cancers of our age and set us on the road that leads to disaster and destruction. We have long memories for injuries

inflicted and a frightening capacity for nursing old sores, all of which poison our spirit and destine us to a life of misery. While the world goes its way of retribution and revenge this gospel tells us that the standard of behaviour for a follower of Christ is the way of friendship and love. The real test of love is the regard we have for those we find little reason to like; those people who are bent on insulting us and causing us harm.

Christ calls us to a radical re-ordering of our lives when He warns us to be on our guard against the all too natural temptation to retaliate by paying back one wrong with another. Instead, we are to demonstrate generosity of heart by seeing beyond our hurts and injustices. Our enemies are given the benefit of the doubt on these occasions when we are gracious enough to offer pardon on the grounds that a person is bigger than his wrongful actions. Furthermore, so much hatred is often the result of ignorance or misunderstanding. Forgiveness is about removing the barriers which block the flow of love and, as a result, damage friendly personal relationships. It is costly and the gospel is the story of the price God had to pay so that our sins could be forgiven. It meant the crucifixion of Jesus Christ on the hill of Calvary so that we could be reconciled with God.

If we are intent upon pleasing our heavenly Father, a consideration of His limitless mercy should prompt us to put the teachings of Jesus into practice. Each of us here can start forgiving right now by curbing a sharp tongue of criticism, suppressing the revenge instinct and accepting the irritating behaviour of a neighbour. The gospel ends with a plea to show compassion for those who have done wrong. Compassion is the outgoing love of God which gives us the ability to appreciate and share the joys and troubles of a neighbour. We can often live in close proximity with people and be unaware of how they really feel and how much they are in need of our help and understanding. As we gather round the table of the Lord, we pray that our hearts may not be insensitive to the sufferings of others but a source of hope and encouragement to those in distress and in need of our help.
