Seventh Sunday of Easter Year A

Dear Brothers and sisters this Sunday is the Seventh Sunday of Easter, previously it was also The Ascension which has now moved to its rightful date last Thursday. In our guides we therefore have two choices of Scripture reading and so I decided to give you two reflections for the price of one in your newsletter, enjoy and the message of Jesus as he interfaces with us in both readings.

The Ascension

"Why are you standing there looking up at the sky?"

The Ascension is one of those moments in the Gospel that feels both glorious and unsettling. Jesus is 'lifted up,' returning to the Father, and the disciples are left staring into the clouds caught between awe and uncertainty. It's a scene we know all too well. We've all had moments when life shifts beyond our control or expectation, when something familiar is taken from our sight, and we're left wondering what comes next.

Jesus doesn't leave His disciples behind; He lifts them up entrusting them with His work. The Gospel is not as a burden but as a promise: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you." The Ascension is an interface between what God has done and what God will do through us. We were all called to 'mission' when the Holy Spirit was bestowed on us at Baptism, therefore the Ascension isn't about absence. It's about trusting in God to support us through thick and thin.

My friends, today's feast reminds us that faith is not lived with our heads in the clouds but with our feet on the ground. The angels' question "Why are you standing there looking up?" isn't a rebuke. It's a nudge; a reminder that the Christian life is forward-facing, outward-looking and Spirit-driven. It never stands still although like many, I do feel it can be slow in changing at times, but this in itself brings the richness of perspective to our spiritual lives.

As we stand between Ascension and Pentecost, we find ourselves in that same holy in-between, waiting, praying, preparing. Jesus has gone before us, not to leave us, but to draw us closer into His life and mission.

So, this week, let's lift our eyes with hope, stepping forward with courage and purpose. Christ has ascended. The Spirit is coming. And the world is waiting for witnesses. Those witnesses are us and we need to grow our faith exponentially so as to maintain and grow our position in UK society. The chocolate sugar rush from Easter will have subsided by now so let's get on with the reality of our lives in Christ.

Seventh Sunday of Easter (A)

"Father... glorify your Son."

The Gospel this Sunday draws us into one of the most intimate moments in all of Scripture: Jesus praying. - not teaching, not healing, not debating, simply praying. And in that prayer, we glimpse His heart. He prays for His disciples, for their protection, for their unity, and for the courage they will need once He is no longer physically with them.

It is striking that Jesus prays before the trials of the Passion, before the Ascension, before the Church is born at Pentecost. He places everything - His mission, friends, and the future Church - into the Father's hands. It is a prayer of trust, of surrender, of love. It is a prayer we all need to learn and say every day.

Note that Jesus prays not only for the disciples gathered around Him, but for all who will come to believe through following His word, and that includes us. You may not realise it but in this moment for you all here at Mass, Jesus holds our names and those of our loved ones before the Father.

As we stand between Ascension and Pentecost, we find ourselves in that same space of waiting and expectation. Jesus has returned to the Father, but the Spirit has not yet come in power. It is a time to pause, to breathe, to pray with Jesus for the gifts we need: unity, courage, protection, and a renewed sense of mission.

This week, perhaps we can echo His prayer in our own lives: that God may be glorified in us, that we may be faithful in the work entrusted to us, and that our parish community may be one in heart and purpose.

Christ prays for us. The Spirit is coming. Let us wait with hope and walk forward with confidence.
