## Ss Peter and Paul Year A

Dear Friends

We can think of tradition as a rather dry and dusty thing. Often it can seem as if tradition is something that we have always done and for which no one can really remember the reason why. Even worse tradition can sometimes seem to get in the way of progress. We end up with some way of acting that does not really meet the needs of modern society, and all because we have done it in a particular way. Tradition, however, does not have to be a dead weight. Understood properly, it is a dynamic thing for it should be the means we not only safeguard our cherished beliefs but also allow them to grow and develop to meet the needs of a modern church and society because tradition is not static open brackets it is something that can be applied in different ways according to different circumstances close brackets it is able to keep the inner meaning of

our faith without binding asked to outdated customs and practises. Tradition is not so much the thing that is handed over as the act of passing it on in a relay race the baton is handed on from one athlete to another so that the same baton arrives the finishing line, tradition is not simply the baton it is the running it is not a gold nugget that we keep in the safe from the time of Jesus until he comes on the last day is more like an acorn that we plants and water over the centuries so that at the second coming we can have an oak forest to present to God.

In order to remain faithful to God's call Peter and Paul had to change the way they thought and acted Peter had to change his mind about Christ as the Messiah for open brackets he thought Jesus was going to be a political leader closed brackets and about whether it was right to eat with pagans Paul had to abandon his reliance on the law and alter his views about whether Christians needed to be circumcised the feast of Peter and Paul reminds us that tradition is not the same as customs it matters little what language we used to worship God it is not crucial to faith whether priests are married or celebrates when we meet on Fridays what colour the vestments are and so on what is important is that we keep alive the meaning of Jesus message and we're not afraid like Peter and Paul to pass it on to future generations

### ***First Holy Communion***

The programme will begin on 5<sup>th</sup> September where pictures will be given out that will be needed for the programme, this will be every week. Enrolment is online through the Parish website. The cut-off date for this is 27<sup>th</sup> September. All work must be completed before then. You and your child will be expected to attend Mass each week. There will be a meeting with Fr Bernard, Dn Tony and Dn Michael. Parents Meeting 8<sup>th</sup> January, the lesson will begin 22<sup>nd</sup> January, then February 27<sup>th</sup>, March 20<sup>th</sup>, March 26<sup>th</sup>, April 17<sup>th</sup>. The communion Mass will be in May.

### ***RCIA***

We will be starting the new RCIA course in September on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm. This is an introductory session and a chance to register your interest. If you are an adult and are not a Catholic, then this is your opportunity to explore the Catholic faith with no commitment. There may be others who have been baptised, and you are more than welcome to join the course and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at Easter.
